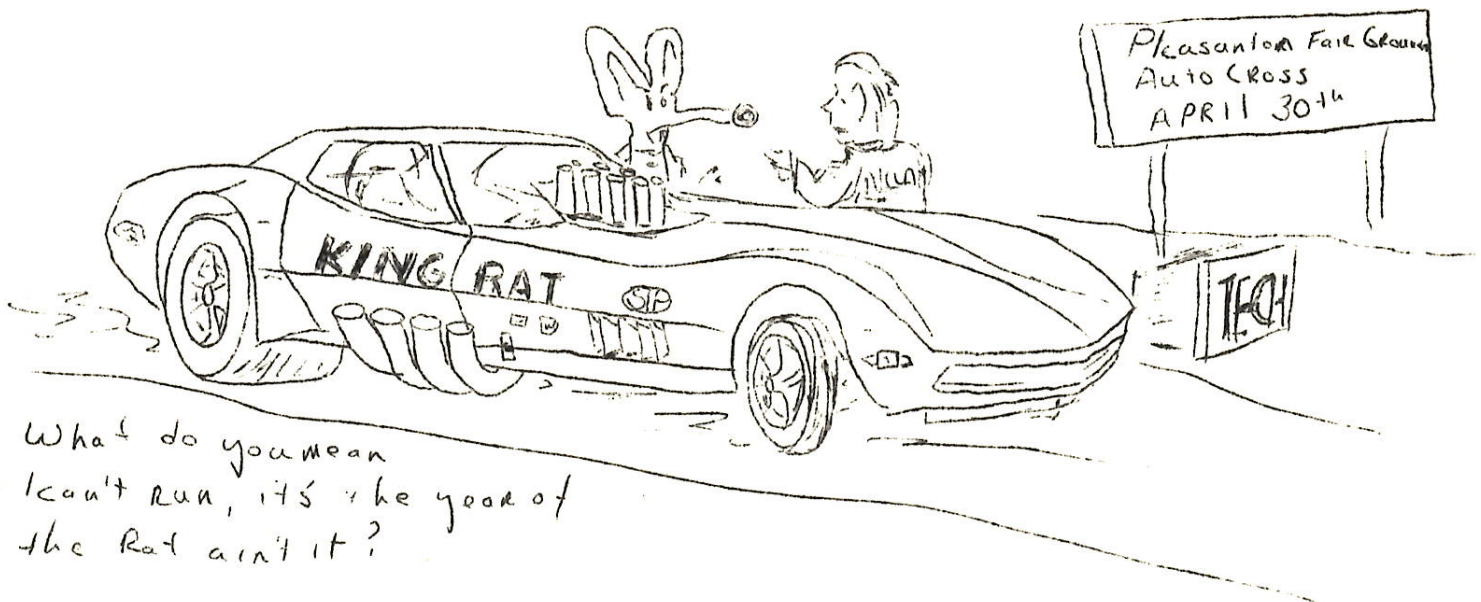

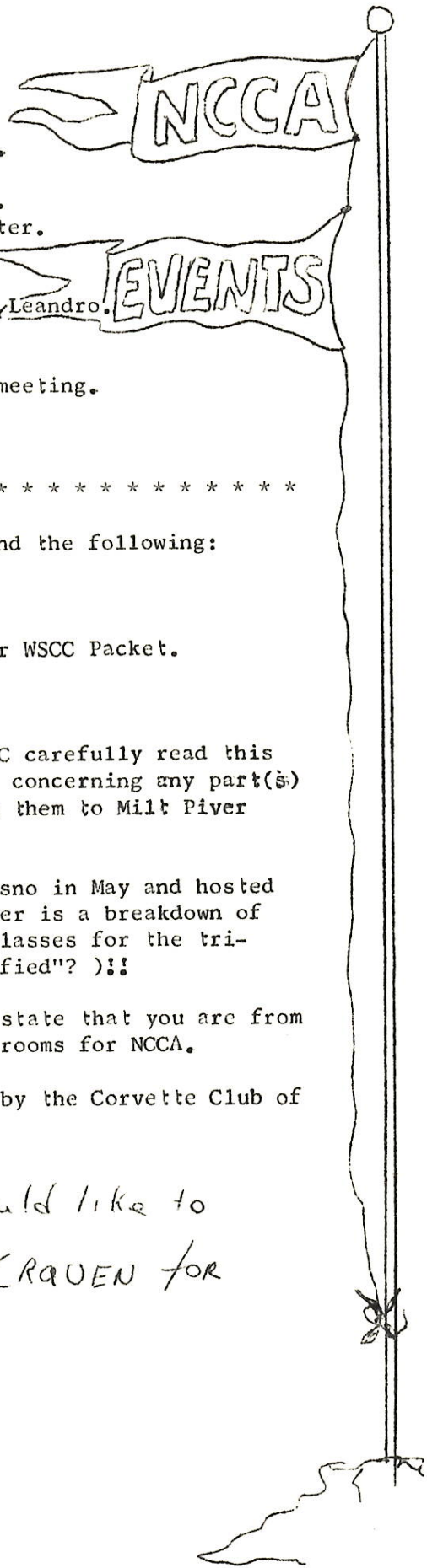

CHANGE TO W.S.C.C. CODE

PART I, SECTION II -- SANCTION

- A. Sanctioned events will be run according to W.S.C.C. codes.
- B. Any club can apply for a Sanction by submitting a written request (Sanction Request Form) to the W.S.C.C. Treasurer along with a \$20.00 performance bond 90 days prior to said event. Approval or denial will be granted by the W.S.C.C. Events Chairman according to the Events Calendar and Guidelines. Said performance bond will be refunded upon receipt of events results, upon denial of said events or upon cancellation of the event if written notice is given 60 days in advance to all W.S.C.C. clubs and Executive Board. If above guidelines are not met, the performance bond will be retained by the W.S.C.C. treasury. Said club will be notified within 15 days of initial application by mail. Annual events will be given preference.

(to be effective 9-1-72)

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE III, Section I: Club Membership

Applicants for Club membership:

- a. same as present except change "80%" to "60%".
- b. "Must have its principal location and operation west of the Mississippi River."
- c. Combine present b, and c, to read "must submit to the Council evidence of club organization including club objectives and membership roster and will be allowed to participate in Council activities."
- d. "Must pay an annual membership fee of \$20.00, payable on the date of acceptance for membership, and in advance, September 1st of each year thereafter."
- e. "Must be accepted by a majority of the Council membership at a regular scheduled meeting of the Council membership."

Section II: Individual Membership

Applicants for individual membership:

- a. no change

- d. "Must pay an annual membership fee of \$5.00, payable in advance, September 1st of each year."

RULES FOR TRICYCLE RACES

1. No motorized vehicles.
2. Maximum 3 wheels - minimum 3 wheels.
3. Name of Club must be on tricycle.
4. No restriction on size of tricycle. Lane width will be approximately 6 feet minimum.
5. No restriction on number of contestants on one tricycle.
6. No part of contestant may touch ground during timed run without penalty.
